## VII. Public Comment:

Helen Kirk, Granville Township: Ms. Kirk questioned if the \$5.00 fee that the commissioners are implementing is on motor vehicles only or does it include the campers in the parks? Commissioner Postal said it includes every registration that you would receive from PennDot. Ms. Kirk stated that the campers in parks are basically a glorified mobile home. Ms. Kirk went on say that mobile homes are real estate taxed and believes these campers should be also.

Chairman Kodish made a couple of announcements: The Tax Claim Office moved upstairs with the Assessment Office and the combination of these offices is now called Tax Services. The Voter Registration and Elections Office remains on the first floor. The Veterans Affairs Office with move in with Elections Office within the next several weeks. We have a staff member that will help with both offices. Chairman Kodish wants to respond to a comment he saw in the Sentinel today regarding the murder trial. Someone made a comment that we are paying for a murder trial that never came. Chairman Kodish stated that the expenses for the trial do not begin the day the trial begins. We are well over \$200,000.00 for that trial and the meter is still running. It will now be a bench trial instead of a jury trial.
