VIII. New Business:

A. Proclamation – National Osteopathic Medicine Week April 18-24, 2022

National Osteopathic Medicine Week April 18-24, 2022

WHEREAS, there are currently 168,701 Osteopathic physicians (DOs) in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is the nation's leader in Osteopathic medicine with over 12,289 licensed DOs in the Commonwealth and 2,561 osteopathic medical students at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, Philadelphia; the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine, Erie and Seton Hill; and

WHEREAS, DOs have made tremendous contributions to the American health care system, including treating U.S. presidents and Olympic athletes, serving as White House physicians, Surgeon General of the U.S. Army, Assistant Secretary for Health for the US Department of Health and Human Services, and sitting on nationwide health care panels; and

WHEREAS, DOs have a strong tradition of ensuring patients in all parts of the country have access to health care, particularly in rural and medically underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, DOs practice a hands-on, whole-body approach, which includes Osteopathic manipulative medicine, to diagnose health problems, treat dysfunctions, preserve good health and prevent the spread of disease; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Osteopathic physicians are dedicated to improving the health of their community through education and awareness-based efforts, as well as by delivering quality health services; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Pennsylvania recognize the need for osteopathic physicians who are committed to improving the health of all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, April 18-24, 2022, is proclaimed as National Osteopathic Medicine Week in Pennsylvania, and all citizens and community organizations are urged to support this observance to help educate Pennsylvania residents about DOs and Osteopathic medicine.

G. Pennsylvania Emergency Management agency 9-1-1 Statewide Interconnectivity Funding Grant Agreement for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 -\$92,977.92

Mr. Lucas said this is an annual grant, non-competitive to pay eligible fees out of the 911 wireless fund. We are using that to fund a couple different projects that are going on in the 911 and GIS update project. It also paying for location information for 911 callers.

Motion was made by Commissioner Postal to be approved. Commissioner Kodish seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

H. Subrecipient Agreement with NuVisions Center for the FFY 2020 Community Development Block Grant CARES Act Funds - \$11,381.00 Ms. Fultz spoke and said this is a standard agreement that DCCD requires us to fill out when the county is giving out funds to another applicant. NuVisions is looking to establish a senior net program. They need \$11,381.00 to purchase equipment. They are looking to teach disabled and senior citizens about technology on I-pads and Laptops. This will be held at the old Creider Mitchell building. There will be 10 participants per class. The need came about during COVID-19 when disabled and senior citizens couldn't talk to loved ones, or attend doctor appointments via Telehealth.

Motion was made by Commissioner Postal to be approved. Commissioner Kodish seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

I. Signature changes on three Register and Recorder Accounts at Mifflin County Savings Bank

J. Intergovernmental Agreement with U.S. Department of Justice to house federal inmates
